Manufactures started to print dress and doll patterns along with embroidery designs to increase sales. Bemis is a Seattle manufacturer that started in 1858 and produced feed sacks and are still in business 150 years later making plastic bags including some for dog and cat food and these are being reused into creative items that you can find on Pinterest.
